



## PARENT / GUARDIAN CODE OF CONDUCT

Breach of any of these rules will lead to disciplinary action.

- 1. Parents/ guardians must respect all members of Revolution Staff. Abusive language/behaviour will not be tolerated towards our staff.
- 2. Parents/ guardians are not allowed into the gymnasium when a session is taking place; viewing areas must be used.
- 3. Parents/ guardians must refrain from communicating with coaches/ helpers and participants during training sessions.
- 4. Complaints must be emailed to the Complaints Team (complaintsrevolutiongymnastics@outlook.com)
- 5. Welfare/Safeguarding Concerns must be emailed to the Welfare Officers (welfarerevolutiongymnastics@outlook.com)
- 6. It is strongly advised that all parents/ guardians do not coach their child after sessions. This is to reduce coaching conflict, safety hazards and so participants do not feel over pressured to perform
- 7. Please make sure that appropriate language/ behaviour is used at all times whilst around other club members.
- 8. Must not demonstrate incidents of slander towards the club, coaches, participants or any other clubs.
- 9. Ensure your child (under 16yrs) is collected promptly at the end of a session from the gymnasium doors. Please notify session coaches in writing via email to (revolutiongymnastics@outlook.com) if other arrangements are in place.
- 10. All gymnasts under 7yrs must have a parent/ guardian on site in case they need the toilet.

## **EVENT / COMPETITION CODE OF CONDUCT**

## Breach of any of these rules will lead to disciplinary action.

- 1. Event fees must be paid by the stated deadline date, failure to do so will result in no participation or disciplinary action. For elite gymnasts they will be automatically entered into competitive events as part of their training programme, though disciplinary action will be taken if entry fees are submitted late.
- 2. Competing gymnasts are expected to attend all outlined sessions prior to the event. Coaches reserve the right to withdraw a gymnast from competition if they feel he/ she is underprepared or has not shown the correct level of commitment.
- 3. Club attire must be purchased and worn to all competitive events.
- 4. Gymnast's competition presentation: suitable hair (tied back if longer than chin), no jewellery, no nail varnish,
- 5. For girls; <u>club kit</u> shorts are optional. This should be brought to the attention of their personal coach.
- 6. Parents / guardians and gymnasts must not approach judges, officials, coaches or other gymnasts during the competition. Any concerns must be brought up with the relevant coaching team when appropriate
- 7. Gymnasts must arrive earlier than their allotted time to warm up (your child's coach will advise on when to arrive), as competition organisers have the right to run early. Please make efforts to inform coaching team if running late.
- 8. Please cheer all club competitors at competitions and do not show un-sportsmanlike behaviour.
